Most of them are women and children and are the victims of torture, abuse, physical and sexual violence. On humanitarian grounds, Bangladesh Government provided them shelter and other facilities. Along with the other development organizations, ACLAB has joined the Govt. initiatives and has been involved in the wellbeing of the displaced Rohingya community

addressing the necessities of health, nutrition, WASH, education, information, relief works, protection, GBV, human trafficking and provide comprehensive services in Cox's Bazar and Bhasanchar Rohingya camp, Hatiya, Noakhali. 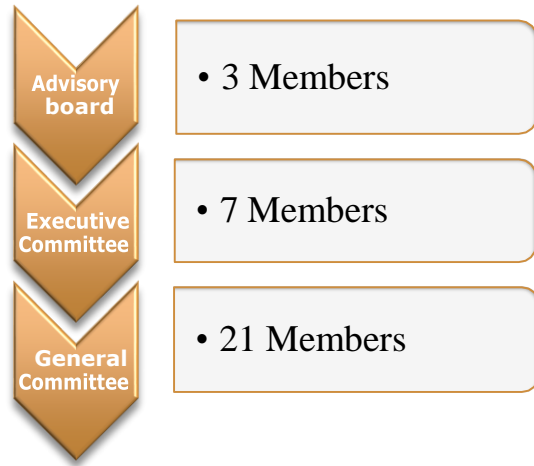

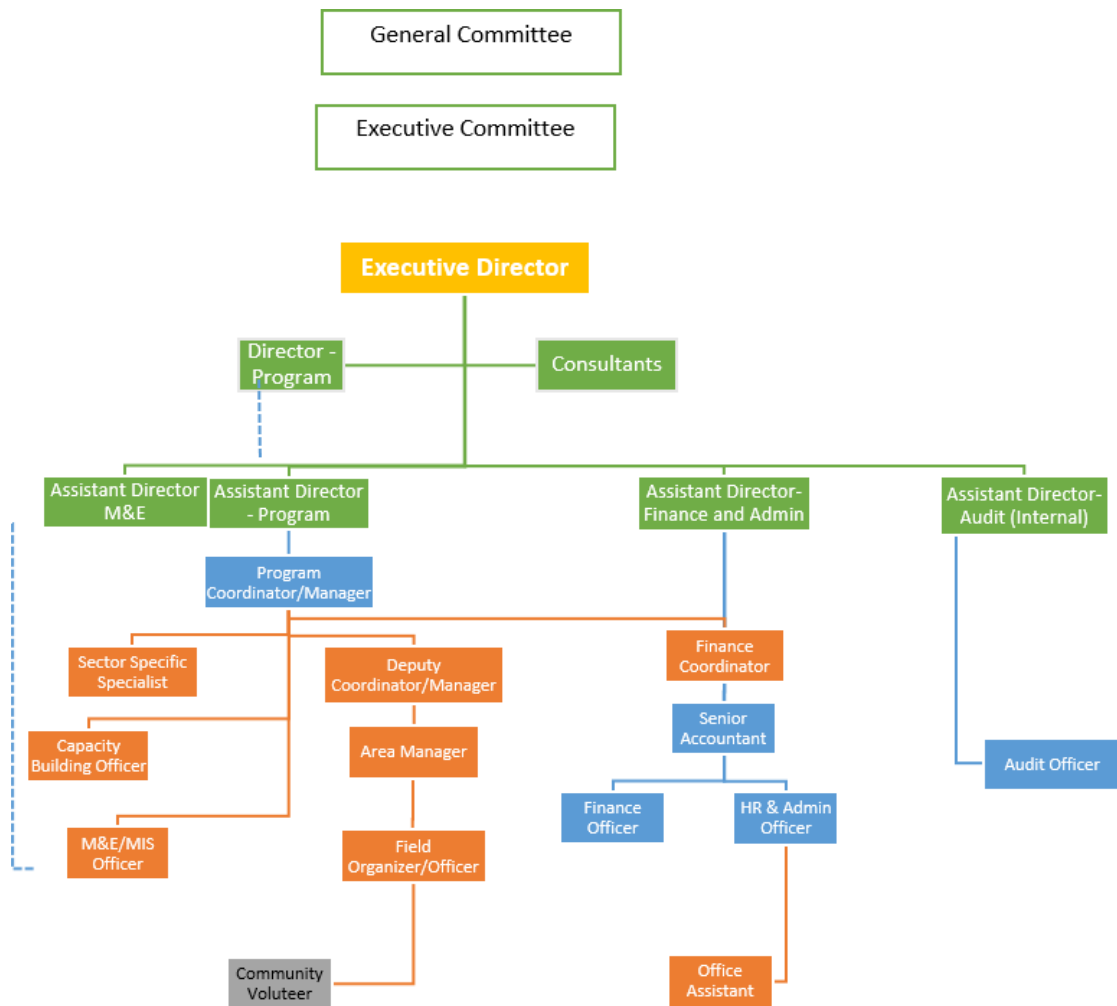

ACLAB PRIORITY WORKING AREA

COMMUNITY RADIO OF ACLAB:



Radio Naf 99.2 FM is a community-based broadcasting media in Teknaf since 2012 broadcasts a program 6 hours daily, in the morning from 10 AM to 1 PM and in the evening from 4 PM to 7 PM through on-air and online streaming. The radio is operating with the permission of the Ministry of information, the Government of Bangladesh. The program aims to ensure the empowerment of marginalized and underprivileged coastal populations and ensure access to information about the rural community and create mass awareness.

Community Radio NAF is developing and broadcasting programs on population control, poverty alleviation, health & nutrition, psycho-social counselling, COVID-19 response, water and sanitation, agriculture, education, local culture, entertainment, sports, fishery, bio- diversity & environment & climate change adaptation, capacity building, rehabilitation, humanitarian response, disaster management, human trafficking, child safety, early marriage, GBV, protection, drug, legal aid & good governance, human rights, social peace, harmony and resilience, ethnic language and cultural diversity etc. The radio program develops in the form of a magazine, live broadcast, drama, expert interview and discussion, local songs, vox-pop, and news mostly in the local language with the participation of local people. It also distributes radio sets and does community-based programs with the engagement of its 132 listener group members and trained volunteers. Near about 1.5 million listeners are covered at Teknaf and Ukhiya including the Rohingya camp in Cox's Bazar district. The radio programs are supported by the government, local administration, donors, community people, private sectors and initiator organizations like Bangladesh Betar, UNICEF, UNDP, WHO, Christian Aid, WFP, Johns Hopkins University, DW Akademia, BRAC, Red Crescent, A2I, Plan International, ICCO, Americare etc.

Since the beginning of Rohingya influx on 2017, Radio NAF is developing and broadcasting radio programmes for both the host and Rohingya community on different life-saving and key behaviours' changed messages and basic awareness programs. Day by day the program demand is increasing and especially after the COVID-19 pandemic radio NAF plays a vital role to disseminate the lifesaving emergency messages.

COX'S BAZAR AUDIO-VISUAL STUDIO:

Considering the importance of lifesaving emergency messages for more than 1.5million host and Rohingya community of Ukhiya and Teknaf, Cox's Bazar, ACLAB has established a connectivity studio of Radio NAF with the support of UNICEF.

The objective of the studio is to support different agencies, CwC WG and sectors by producing short audio/visual content on different lifesaving messages. The main activity of this studio is to producing short audio/visual production based on demand from CwC WG or Sectors or donors; producing Puthi/local song of Cox's Bazar region; managing subject matter specialist or expert for Radio NAF production; producing and managing interview of district-level administration of Govt. NGOs/INGOs, UN agencies; Producing documentary as per need; support sectors and the working group as per requirement and availability of schedule; Photography, Videography, Audio Program Record, Audio/Video Editing; Interactive Popular Theater (IPT) etc.

THE INTERVENTIONS OF ACLAB AT BHASHAN CHAR ROHINGYA CAMP:

In the Ashrayan-3 project at Bhashan Char, Hatiya Upazila, Noakhali district, Bangladesh a total of 1 lakh Rohingya are planned to rehabilitate. Besides the local administration, NGO bureau, RRRC, and Bangladesh Navy, ACLAB has extended its support to humanitarian response. With the approval from NGO Affairs Bureau, ACLAB is doing different interventions to provide humanitarian assistance for the FDMN. The objective is to take part in the government effort and to provide humanitarian assistance for the relocated Rohingya at Bhashan Char Camp.

Beside food and non-food item distribution, and providing support in the registration process ACLAB is doing livelihood activities like Fish culture, home-based vegetable cultivation, vocational training etc. Livelihood items distribution (sewing machine, cloth etc.) and education materials (paper, books etc.) distribution of vegetable seeds, among the Rohingya community at Bhashan Char.

The intervention details of ACLAB ongoing projects in Bhasan Char:

- An information feedback center supported by UNICEF.
- Livelihoods intervention (Duck, Sheep, and rabbit farm under livestock & livelihood based agro farm) Fish culture, Home-based gardening, vocational training and vegetable seeds distribution etc.
- 24 Learning Centre in 3 shelters (6, 8, 24) as per UNHCR guidelines.
- WASH & waste management intervention between 13 clusters and benefited 1507 families. Awareness session for Health, hygiene, menstrual health management, DRR and environment adolescent girls and women.
- 4 CFS for child protection and 6 CBCPC committee, who are the voluntary promoter for GVB & protection-related activities.

- Tree plantation for Environment sustainability. (Recently we procure 20pcs Krishnachura tree for the CiC office).

ENVIRONMENT AND BIODIVERSITY CONSERVATION:

ACLAB is implementing the Environmental and Biodiversity Conservation program since 2016. The program aims to promote eco-friendly tourism in Cox's Bazar, beach cleaning, waste management, and protect the environment and biodiversity of Cox's Bazar district. Plantation and awareness-raising activities are implementing in the Rohingya camps of Cox's Bazar and Bhasanchar also.

CHILD-FRIENDLY SPACES (CFS):

One of the important components of ACLAB's Rohingya intervention is creating Child-Friendly Spaces (CFS). ACLAB established CFS in Rohingya Camps which provide opportunities for children with education, play, communication with other children, fun and recreational facilities. ACLAB team organized different types of activities like arranged toys, play materials, education materials, books that are suitable for children. The volunteers are responsible for the operation of these centers provided with the necessary knowledge and orientation on management and protection of children. Child-Friendly Spaces are also

used for psychosocial counseling.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITIES:

Activities such as awareness sessions on HIV/AIDS & STIs, Malaria, COVID-19, vaccination, Nutrition, mother & child care, personal hygiene, human trafficking, social peace and harmony, etc. are being carried out by volunteers and ACLAB staff. Activities also include advocacy meetings, community orientation, community mobilization, IEC materials distribution, and community miking in the host and Rohingya communities.

OUTREACH AWARENESS PROGRAM:

ACLAB and Radio NAF 99.2 FM are implementing outreach activities for the Rohingyas as well as for host communities. Activities include orientation for community people on different issues, distribution of radio sets, setting up information hubs inside the camps, communication and meeting with stakeholders, communication with camp management authorities, coordination with local administration, deployment of volunteers for relief distribution and information dissemination, information of listener groups, etc.

Enhancing social and behavior practices for wellbeing of children, women and communities in Cox's Bazar including Rohingya Refugee Camps:

In Cox's Bazar ACLAB is working on a UNICEF C4D project for both the host community and Rohingya to strengthen community accountability mechanisms, community engagement & social mobilization through radio programmers and information & feedback centers (IFCs). There are eight IFCs where the information and service provider (ISPs) provides necessary information and referral services to the service seekers. There is a GBV counselling corner for women at every IFC by a female ISP against GBV or other gender-based issues. ISPs also visit door to door for identification and registration of the problem with referral services. Since June 2020, 1400 Male and 4218 Females of the host community and 6000 Male and 5800 females of the Rohingya community have been taken service from the IFC and 4200 Females and 3980 Male have been served by the radio listeners club.

The Activities of the Project is to provide Information & Feedback Center to the Rohingya and Host community, Lifesaving messaging, Community Mobilization, Stakeholder meeting, community

consultation, advocacy, Risk communication among the Host and Rohingya community, basic skill development training, linkage and referral services, monitoring the progress of the project management team through site visits etc. Currently, the project has started operation at Bhasan Char through an IFC and has a wish to expand the service.

MALARIA PREVENTION & CONTROL PROGRAM:



ACLAB has been working in the malaria elimination program at Teknaf, Chakaria and Pekua Upazilla under Cox's Bazar District from July'2007 with the expanded area at Teknaf Upazilla from January'2018

to 2023. Under the guidance of GoB and with the technical support of BRAC, a dedicated team of ACLAB has been working in the community to achieving of the vision of 'A malaria-free Bangladesh' and providing a significant contribution to the country's achievement.

The objective of the program was to control malaria in the identified regions of the country through preventive and curative activities. But now the program's intervention is Malaria elimination. Activities of the program providing clinical services through Lab Centers comprising diagnostic, treatment, and referral services, creating community awareness through advocacy meetings, Mosquito Net distribution and treatment, household survey, training, orientation on BCC, popular Theatre & Folk Song, advocacy meetings, lab operation (diagnostic, treatment and referral), distribution of LLIN/ITN, mass campaign, coordination & referral. As a outcome of the program, now the beneficiaries are aware of the causes, prevention and treatment of malaria. Preventive measures and treatment of malaria are available in the project area. 5, 57,600 people in the project areas are getting benefit from the project. Number of malaria patients are gradually decreasing and recovery rate from malaria is almost 100%.

SUPPORT TO HOST COMMUNITIES AFFECTED BY ROHINGYA INFLUX IN COX'S BAZAR DISTRICT (SHARIP):

Since January 2020 ACLAB, with the funding of DANIDA and UNDP Cox's Bazar, ACLAB is implementing the project SHARIP to strengthen the capacity of the population in the Chittagong Hill Tracts to shape and make decisions that impact their lives with the specific objective to "strengthened community land, resource and livelihood management." Besides this the Rohingya influx in the later part of 2017 is one of the major humanitarian concerns for Bangladesh where over 1 million FDMN has taken shelter at Ukhiya and Teknaf, Cox's Bazar Bangladesh fled from Myanmar by facing ethnic violence. This has added tension among the host community of Cox's Bazar to meet up their livelihood, income, basic needs as they are sharing their community resources with the FDMN. To reduce this tension and to ensure social peace, cohesion, harmony among the local community of Ramu, Ukhiya and Teknaf, Cox's Bazar the project is working in all over 22 Unions of this 3 Upazilas along with the Saint Martin Union. The ultimate objective of the project is to promote peace and social harmony at the grassroots level with the engagement of vulnerable farmers, local government and administrative representatives, youth, students, teachers, religious leaders etc.

One of the major activity of the project is the formation of the local volunteer mediator forum (LVMF) to minimize and reduce domestic violence and gender-based violence, conflict within family members and neighbours, awareness-raising courtyard session with farmers field schools, martial art training for girls, football tournaments for girls and boys, school debate competition, training on conflict management and mediation for LVMF members, local street drama, day observance, inter-religious dialogues, innovative youth engagement in the promotion of social cohesion, tolerance and conflict, youth engaged campaign programs on various issues (anti-drug, gender-based violence & human trafficking, cleaning Number neighbourhood & stopping polythene use, distribution of hygiene and agriculture input packages for COVID-19 response etc.

The achievement of the project is 800 courtyard session on communication, leadership, conflict management, gender, social capital and COVID-19, 200 Awareness raising programs on promotion of social cohesion at Union level i.e. Day observance programs, LVMF training & exchange programs, street drama, courtyard session through Radio NAF, inter-religious dialogues, 8 Innovative youth engagement, debate programs, football tournaments, martial art, youth campaigns, annual cultural programs for schools, student exchange, 250 disputes/conflicts resolved as a consequence of the project, 44% participating households engaged in various community groups/forums, 6 Local Volunteer Mediators Forum operational at Upazila level, 40 IFM-FFS and 6 LVMFs receiving training on conflict mediation, 80 awareness raising programs on promotion of social cohesion at Union level and innovative youth engagement and innovative youth engagement.

COMMUNITY COHESIONS IN COX'S BAZA (CCP) AND EFFICIENT ACCOUNTABILITY LOCAL GOVERNMENT (EALG):

Since August 2021, ACLAB has been implementing the project "Community Cohesion in Cox's Bazar (CCP) and Efficient and Accountable Local Governance (EALG)" funded by UNDP, Cox's Bazar. The project has been initiated to achieve the objective to improve the peace and stability, women's empowerment, and local leadership capacity building to address and defuse conflict and tensions that have been raised after the influx of the Rohingya Community in Cox's Bazar, especially at the Upazila of Teknaf and Ukhiya. The Community Cohesion component has two outputs. One is to "Improve Economic Resilience: Addressing economic tensions. And another output is to "Build Social Cohesion: To dismiss narrative myths which perpetuate perceptions of inequality and misinformation between groups. The project worked with social activists, local media (radio), interfaith leadership and women's groups to implement a series of quick-impact confidence and social cohesion activities in Cox's Bazar. These activities had both a Prevention of Violent Extremism (PVE) and a peace-building focus. Another component of the project is efficient and accountable Local Governance (EALG) to strengthen the capacities of local governments (Upazila Parishad and Union Parishad) to foster participatory local development.

The objective of the EALG component is to strengthen the capacities of local governments and other stakeholders to foster participatory local development service delivery for the SDGs. EALG has three components: a) Inclusive and Accountable Upazila Parishad (IAUZP); b) Sustainable and Democratic Local Government (SDUP); and c) Policy for Effective Local Governance (PELG).

ENHANCE THE CAPACITY OF CSOS/CBOS TO ENGAGE IN HUMAN RIGHTS ADVOCACY AND AWARENESS-RAISING IN COX'S BAZAR DISTRICT:

The main objective of the project is to increase and enhance the capacity of CSO's and CBO's and create awareness on human rights issues in Cox's Bazar district. ACLAB has implemented the project with the collaboration of the Cox's Bazar CSO-NGO Coalition for Human Rights (a coalition of 35 CSO members) in all the 8 Upazila of Cox's Bazar district. The project has covered 15,000 direct and 1 lac indirect beneficiaries all over the district.

The main activities of the project was the sensitization and advocacy meeting with local administration, local government, law and enforcement agency; activation of the legal aid committee at the union, Upazila and district level; sensitization of the community about the rights of the Dalit and indigenous community; right based community radio program; coordination and networking with coalition members; youth assembly; linkage and referral to duty bearers; formation of Watchdog committee; engaging mass people against human rights violence; capacity building training of coalition members; publish situation report of human rights violation; publish and disseminate IEC material etc.

IGP (INCOME GENERATION PROGRAM):

Since 2004 the IGA project is running with the collaboration of the Department of Social Welfare of the Bangladesh government at Sharsha Upazila of Jashore and at Jhenaidah district. The objective of the program is to assist the poor, landless, small farmers & petty businessmen, people from the fishermen Community, Dalits and insolvent Women of the project area with monetary support to pursue a profession to attain self-reliance and live a decent life. Activities of the program are to enroll borrowers of the project area are provided loans at a minimum interest rate of 13.1% and easy instalments for one year. They can obtain repeated loans after the payment of the earlier loans. The outcome of the project is the number of borrowers has reached 1500 most of who are engaged in small business, farming, fishery, hatchery, cattle head rising, poultry, tailoring, etc.

VULNERABLE GROUP DEVELOPMENT (VGD):

The VGD- Vulnerable Group Development program is one of the most extensive social safety net programs in Bangladesh that exclusively targets ultra-poor rural Women. The VGD Programme at Cox's Bazar and Chittagong district of Bangladesh is running with the support of the Department of Women Affairs, Ministry of Women and Child Affairs, Government of The People's Republic of Bangladesh. The main objective of the project is to raise awareness and build the capacity on loan, savings, and small entrepreneurship, enable the poorest and the most disadvantaged women in rural Bangladesh to overcome food insecurity and low social status in a sustainable way and other socio-cultural issues. In the VGD program of 2020, a number of 2360 vulnerable females in Lama Upazila and 285 in Naikhongchari Upazila have been covered. The project staffs identified the target population, aware them of the objectives and activities of the program and their roles and actions, provided them information and knowledge about different vocations/trades, and provided training to be socio-economically self-reliant and lead life with social dignity. A large number of activities have been accomplished under the project i.e. delivering a monthly ration of rice for 12 months among the beneficiary group in Fashiakhali and Patong, Lama Upazila; providing skill development and income-generating training on home gardening, self-hygiene and cleanliness sessions regarding the COVID-19 pandemic etc.

HIV/AIDS/STD, Sexual Harassment Prevention and Gender Awareness Programme:

ACLAB is working with the OTJ JV and IHI-SMCC Joint Venture to implement the "HIV/AIDS/STD, sexual harassment prevention, and gender awareness program" project at the construction site of Jamuna bridge at the eastern and western site. ACLAB is implementing the HIV/AIDS/STD, sexual harassment prevention and gender awareness program among the employees, workers and security persons of the contractor & subcontractors working on the construction sites. Besides this targeted population, the community people residing adjacent to the construction site are also targeted for intervention. ACLAB to

ensure the safety of the targeted population from HIV/AIDS/STD & by implementing the activities including raising awareness to make them knowledgeable through conducting orientation, workshops, training, advocacy, condom promotion, etc.

INTEGRATION OF EYE CARE INTO HEALTHCARE SERVICES FOR THE ROHINGYA PEOPLE AND THE HOST COMMUNITY IN SOUTH EAST BANGLADESH:

ACLAB is ensuring only eye care response in Cox's Bazar Teknaf and Ukhiya Upazila with Orbis international Bangladesh in collaboration with CBBSH. The project is addressing the preventable forms of blindness as needed; setting up emergency eye referral processes as feasible; integrating primary eye care (PEC) into the primary health care (PHC) system; provide basic eye services (cataract surgery and provision of eyeglasses) without discrimination, as resources allow. The project is doing several consultations and meetings with representatives from the eye sector, health sector meetings etc. An eye sector working group established under the refugee health sector umbrella.

CHILD LABOR IMPROVEMENTS IN BANGLADESH (CLIMB):



Tailoring training on skill development of marginalized women at Cox's Bazar

ACLAB is working on the CLIMB project at Cox's Bazar addressing the child labour in the dried fish sector implemented by ACLAB with the support of WINROCK International from December 2019 and the project will end in March 2021. The goal of the project is to reduce child labour and increase acceptable conditions of work in the dried fish sector (DFS) in southeast Bangladesh. The objective of the project is to improve the capacity of civil society to understand and address child labour and forced child labour and promote acceptable conditions of work for children in the dried fish sector (DFS) in southeast Bangladesh.

Activities of the project are to activation and functioning of the District and Upazila Child Labor Monitoring committee, meeting with DCLMC and UCLMC as per GOB committee resolution, observation of National and International Day, BCC material and billboard establishments for awareness, Capacity building consultation workshops with DCLMC & UCLMC and relevant ministries, Capacity building training on existing policies and effective advocacy for CSOs, Organize workshops to develop rapport/network/platform with relevant government, non-government service providers, Referral/linkage with GO/NGOs/CSOs and other service providers for CL, Families and service providers on the social safety net of the government and private sector on alternative livelihood and IGA, update the Service Directory, Sign MOU with different service providers (Government/Private), Actively link communities to govt. agencies for skill development and livelihood services, Training of CSO Partners in the referral network, Consultation workshop with govt. agencies on situation and needs of vulnerable families, Engage the private sector on low skill job opportunities, Advocacy workshop and access of youth to the minimum level of education, Strengthen Advocacy and access of youth to the minimum level of education, Advocacy to the DFS Business association.

The achievement of the project is full formal meeting of respective CLMC (Sadar Upazila -3, Maheshkhali -3, DCLMC-3); Develop action plan to improve CL situation in respective areas; Visit DFS areas and observe the situation; Support relief (food) from Cox's Bazar Sadar child labor monitoring committee to CL families in DFS; Distribute Hygiene kits- 50 HHs, Relief Food- 133, Technical Training on poultry and Goat Rearing –50, Technical training on computer- 12, Technical Training on Sewing Machine- 82, Provide livelihood training on Poultry Rearing with inputs: 145 HHs, Goat Rearing with inputs 75 HHs, Tailoring with inputs 21 HHs, Develop advocacy and awareness-raising materials i.e. Training Module, leaflet, poster, sticker; Capacity building training to CSOs (Organize 3 batch Training) on laws and policies, referral linkage, market linkage; Organize several awareness-raising program (Day observation,

Rally, Billboard installation etc.) at community level to improve the CL situation in DFS.

NFE & SDT PROGRAM UNDER ERADICATION OF HAZARDOUS CHILD LABOR IN BANGLADESH (PHASE 4TH):

To reduce hazardous child labor the Ministry of Labor & Employment, Government of Peoples Republic of Bangladesh has introduced the Non Formal Education (NFE) & Skill Development Training (SDT) program under “Eradication of Hazardous Child Labor in Bangladesh (4th Phasa) project.” ACLAB is implementing the NFE for first 6 months and SDT for the next 4 months from January to October 2022 at the ward no. 57, Kamrangir Char, Dhaka. This is an initiative to create awareness against child labor & education for children.

HIV/AIDS AND STI PREVENTION PROGRAM AT MATARBARI CONSTRUCTION SITES:

To prevent the transmission of HIV and STIs among the workers, transport workers and employees at the construction sites and community people residing adjacent to the construction sites of Matarbari Power Coal Project area ACLAB is implemented the HIV/AIDS & STI Prevention Program supported by Sumitomo and JICA, Japan. A total number of 6,000 persons consisting of workers, employees and people of adjacent communities of the sites have been covered by the orientation sessions making them aware of the causes of HIV/AIDS & STI infections, letting them know about the preventive measures and also removing misconceptions regarding those.

Under the project, a baseline survey has been undertaken identifying 30,000 people and 2 basic Training of Peer Educators have been organized for 75 personnel, 5 advocacy workshops with community leaders, public representatives, and local elite among 100 participants along with the sensitization sessions for local employees, Orientation session for workers and community, Security personnel and community people awareness session, Peer Educator Training, Voluntary Counselling and Testing has been done.



HIV/STI awareness program

BASIC LITERACY PROJECT:

To fulfil the national goal along with the vision of eradicating illiteracy from Bangladesh in cooperation with BNFE, ACLAB has been working on the Basic Literacy Program. The key focus groups under this program are mainly illiterate adolescents and adults of 15-45 age. A baseline survey has been done to select the target group, the place for establishing satellite schools and probability of participating & cooperation of local people etc.; 300 schools in two shifts (1 shift for men and 1 shift for women) for the illiterate adolescent with 25 participants for each class; various extracurricular activities, such as sports, excursions, debate, painting, observing different national and international days, e.g. Child Rights Week, Mother's Day, Child Labor Day, World Child Daughter Day, and World Education Day; Non –formal Education; Adult Literacy; Life skill development training; awareness training; Formation of Center Management Committees; community-based learning center.

NON-FORMAL PRIMARY EDUCATION PROGRAM:

To realize the national goal of eradicating illiteracy from Bangladesh, since 2006 ACLAB has been implementing the Non-Formal Education Program for Children (NFEP) through 105 education centers with the cooperation of BRAC. Through this program, during the period, a total of 450 children have been covered in Chakaria and Teknaf Upazilas of Cox's Bazar district. The segregated number is 290 students (142 Male and 148 Female) of 10 schools at Chakaria and 160 students (Male 62 & Female 98) of 6 schools of Teknaf, Cox's Bazar.

The main objective of the project is to eradicate illiteracy from Bangladesh by fulfilling the national goal with mentionable activity like extra-curricular activities, such as sports, excursions, debating, painting; different national and international day observation, e.g., Child Rights Week, Mother's Day, Child Labor Day, World Child Daughter Day, and World Education Day; providing Non – formal Education; community meeting and participation; Formation and activation of Central Management Committee (CMC) for monitoring activities at the local level.

RISK MITIGATION ON COVID-19 THROUGH COMMUNITY RADIO AND COMMUNICATION WITH COMMUNITIES:

The project “Risk mitigation on COVID-19 through community radio and communication with communities” with the support of ICCO in Teknaf and Ukhiya Upazila of Cox’s Bazar district has been implemented by ACLAB. The objective of the project is to create awareness regarding the COVID-19 outbreaks and making the community aware of the preventive measures. Major activities of the project are to develop and disseminate mass awareness-raising poster, leaflet, festoon, banner, bulletin on COVID-19; Social media promotion; publish of e- newsletter; loudspeaker messaging or community miking; Personal hygiene and protective materials distribution; audio and visual interview of experts on COVID-19 outbreaks; community Radio program etc.

COVID-19 COMMUNITY MESSAGING FOR HOST COMMUNITY:

Focus on host communities in Ukhiya, Teknaf, Ramu and Pekua at Cox’s Bazar to convey necessary information’s on COVID-19 along with its preventive measures ACLAB has worked with the project in coordination with MDM (Médecins du Monde) France with the objective of deliver key messages on COVID-19 prevention and preparedness through the development, production and broadcasting of loud speaker content, radio content, increase stock of PPE and temperature equipment to frontline government staff at health complexes, other government institutions and for journalists on a gap and needs basis so they can better handle the Covid-19 emergency.

Activities of the project was to disseminate emergency Covid-19 response loudspeaker messages, distributed PPE, networking with protection and education Sector for wider use of the assessments tools, radio broadcasting regarding Covid-19 & GBV and MHPSS, coordinated with other health and protection actors, conducted survey of radio listeners, including information on total number of people receiving messaging and accessing messaging impact, assessed needs and gaps for PPE and temperature equipment for Health Complexes and other government front liners, Procured and distributed tem.

PREVENTION OF COVID-19 THROUGH CREATING AWARENESS AND UPHOLDING THE RIGHTS & PROMOTING THE WELLBEING OF ROHINGYA AND THEIR HOST COMMUNITY IN TEKNAF AND UKHIYA (SUB DISTRICT) OF COX'S BAZAR DISTRICT, BANGLADESH:

With the vision to promote the well-being of Rohingya and the host community adolescents and to uphold the rights of the patients affected by COVID-19, a project has been implemented by ACLAB from July to October 2020 at Teknaf and Ukhiya Upazila in Cox's Bazar District in collaboration with Americares. This project was targeted 38 secondary schools (21 schools in Ukhiya and 17 schools in Teknaf) in host communities and 30 adolescents' clubs within Rohingya camp to convey the positive messages promoting adolescent's health including mental health that can reach thousands more at-risk and vulnerable, adolescents.

The objective of the project is to direct its activities focusing on the COVID-19 pandemic, making restrictions of transmission of COVID-19, raise awareness on different issues through a range of different activities planned rigorously assessing the needs of the camps and the schools. Along with that, it also aims to supply a wide range of protective equipment and facilitates proper hygienemaintenance and combat COVID-19 with better preparedness. The project also takes into consideration the MHPSS messaging to support the vulnerable youth groups.

Activities of the project were to established communication with 38 schools and 30 camps based Adolescent clubs in the target community; reprint and distribution of information and awareness-raising materials approved by WHO/MHO (taking necessary consultation) related to COVID-19 case identification, preventive measures including social distancing, etc.; communication campaigns using social media, loudspeaker announcement (miking) and Community Radio (in local and Myanmar

languages); installation of hands-free hand-washing stations in schools as required; procurement and distribution of PPE and mask to the health facilitators/ service providers; procurement and distribution of dignity kits among the adolescents.

ENVIRONMENT AND TREE PLANTATION:

This project was launched by ACLAB with the support from Action Aid Bangladesh for tree plantation in the Rohingya camp and adjacent community areas in order to protect environmental degradation and soil erosion by engaging local youths and community leaders. As a result of forcefully displaced Myanmar nationals came to Bangladesh, a huge loss of trees and forest areas has been brought to the camp and surrounding area. About 1485 hectares of forest land in Ukhiya and Teknaf Upazila have already been damaged. So under the project, 5000 saplings have been planted at Balukhali 2/2, Rohingya Camp No. 11 & 12 with the engagement of youth and community leaders (Majhi) of Rohingya.

COMMUNITY RADIO PROGRAM UNDER AHP PROJECT:

ACLAB has implemented the project through a community radio program in coordination with Plan International Bangladesh focusing on the wellbeing of girls & boys (adolescent and youth) and women also. Through community Radio NAF 99.2 FM, the project highlighted different social issues i.e. child protection Risks and mitigations in any Disaster situations including COVID-19, prevention of child trafficking and children's engagement in the risky labour sector, COVID-19 impact on Women & Girls traditional gender roles as caregivers, positive parenting during COVID-19 outbreak and motivation to continue Girls education, Gender-based violence in the home during COVID-19, sexual and reproductive health and rights (SRHR) management for adolescence and youth girls and women during COVID-19,

prevention of early marriage during COVID-19 and role of caregivers, education during and after COVID-19 etc. The objective of the project is to create social awareness among the community of Teknaf Upazila of Cox's Bazar. On-air discussion about the hurdles of girls & boys (adolescence and youth) and women in some context and how to overcome their respective problems.

Activities of the project were broadcasting on-air Radio sessions on different social problems that are faced by the girls & boys (adolescence and youth) and also women in some context; experts interview on important topics that are related to the issues of women, girls & boys (adolescence and youth) and also discussing the solutions to the particular problem; youth representative participation on different topics of social issues as they can relate more to the problems of their generation; forming CM and referral pathway (Health Service Information).

BROADCASTING EMERGENCY AWARENESS MESSAGE THROUGH COMMUNITY RADIO FOR FDMN AND HOST COMMUNITY:

ACLAB along with the support of BRAC has implemented the project from November 2020 to next year October so that the FDMN and host community can have access to sufficient lifesaving information and can play a key role to be aware of the community. The objective of the project is to disseminate life-saving Radio messages broadcasted for Rohingya and Host Communities in four unions of Teknaf, and Ukhiya Upazila of Cox's Bazar District.

Activities of the project are issue-based radio program development; broadcasting and re-broadcasting of radio programs; community messaging through the loudspeaker (miking); awareness materials (posters, flyers, leaflets & festoon etc.); development and distribution and 02 minutes Audio Visual production on project achievement; listeners club formation; emergency HR and Admin support for quality program implementation on COVID-19.

LEARNING CONTINUITY: INTERACTIVE ONLINE AND RADIO-BASED PROGRAM FOR TEACHERS AND CHILDREN IN ROHINGYA AND HOST COMMUNITIES:

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, ACLAB has initiated the project funded by Save the Children from June 2020 to May 2021. The overall objective of the project is to support refugee children's well-being and learning continuity through interactive Radio Instruction and E-learning courses for host community teachers in Teknaf Upazila, Cox's Bazar.

Activities of the project are broadcasting and on-air 25/30 minutes radio sessions (1 time per day, 3 days a week for six months in total 72 sessions); on-air complimentary messages for parents and caregivers along with regular radio sessions; delivering monthly analysis report depending on the number of listeners reached.

WASH AND GENDER-BASED VIOLENCE PROTECTION FOR ROHINGYA AND HOST COMMUNITY:

Presently, almost a quarter of the world's population, South Asia faces a turbulent water future. Cox's Bazar is one of the southern districts of Bangladesh where the Forcibly Displaced Myanmar Nationals (FDMN) sheltered after the influx in August 2017. Cox's Bazar has been facing the safe water, sanitation and hygiene crisis for sudden increasing the population more than its maximum level of capacity. The influx clearly showed that water distribution systems in Cox's Bazar area in a crumbling situation. As a result, this project was initiated by ACLAB to improve the situation of Water Sanitation and Gender-based violence to protect the Rohingya and host community funded by BRAC. The objective of the project is to ensure regular, sufficient, equitable and dignified access for Rohingya refugee women, men, boys and girls living in camps, and affected host communities, to safe water for drinking and domestic needs, sanitation facilities to allow rapid, safe and secure access at all times, ensure the change of potentially dangerous behaviours through participatory hygiene promotion and distribution of hygiene items with particular focus on contagious diseases, for all refugees and targeted host communities and engaged boys and man in SGBV prevention and response.

Activities of the project are to developing the provision of WASH services to protect the quality of the water supply system facilities and treatment centers; engaged boys and men in SGBV prevention and response; raise awareness through community mobilization of the importance of water resource management; community-based sanitation and hygiene promotion; staff orientation/meeting; inception meeting with Ukhiya Upazilla administration in Jamtoli Camp and UNO, Ukhiya Office; construction of two-chamber latrines in Camp-15 (2 latrines) and host community (2 latrines), a bathing cubicle in camp-15 (3 cubicles) and in host community (1 cubicle), and tube well in camp-15 (3 tube wells) & in host community (1 tube wells) at Ukhiya Upazila; reporting and documentation.

ACCESS TO INFORMATION THROUGH COMMUNITY RADIO PROGRAMMING FOR ROHINGYAS AND HOST COMMUNITIES:

ACLAB has promoted a media (Community Radio) to disseminate information among the Rohingya and Host communities in cooperation with JWW. The objective of the project is to disseminate necessary information's among the Rohingya and Host communities in Ukhiya & Teknaf Upazila, Cox's Bazar.

Activities of the project is to capacity building basic training on Radio Program development techniques for 120 young people, from community people; development of production setup in Cox's Bazar where trained youths will be able to receive capacity building training to produce content, recording, editing, and radio program development; production of 12-community radio program (20-30 minutes long radio programs to be broadcast through Radio Naf 99.2FM; distribution of 400 radio sets to local/host community members in Cox's Bazar; formation of 10 radio listeners clubs in community at Cox's Bazar, with 8 groups located in the communities in Ukhiya & Teknaf Upazila, Cox's Bazar in the host community.

INTEGRATED SUPPORT OF HEALTH AND PROTECTION FOR ROHINGYA & HOST COMMUNITY OF COX'S BAZAR:

ACLAB initiated this project under DFID-project in coordination with BRAC for providing support of health and protection for Rohingya & Host community in Cox's Bazar. The objective of the project is to provide integrated support of health and protection for the Rohingya & Host community of Cox's Bazar. Activities of the project was to community-led initiatives supported by humanitarian actors; attendants at multi-media awareness-raising activities; build the leadership capacity of selected Rohingya women; build awareness of Rohingya women and host community; change agent working on SGBV prevention; provide Case Management services to GBV survivors.

Though this was a short-term intervention the activities of this project were so contemporary which already has marked its footprint among the community people. Some of the major impacts are as follows-

- A strong and effective communication bridge has been established between the projectand communities.
- Beneficiaries especially women got different messages related to their rights mostly GBV, education, Health, Wash and Protection.
- Both communities are a little sensitive in terms of social cohesion and gettingknowledge/idea of each other lifestyle & feelings.
- Community interest has grown on messaging channels/media, particularly on Audio-Visual shows.
- Youths were introduced with a community-led approach which will help them to mitigatelocal problems discussing with appropriate local authorities.

PROGRAMME FOR EMERGENCY RELIEF OPERATION FOR DISASTER VICTIMS:

ACLAB has arranged a program for emergency relief operations for disaster victims in cooperation with JWW for the host and Rohingya communities in Ukhiya Upazila, Cox's Bazar. The objective of the project is to provide emergency relief operations for disaster victims in UkhiyaUpazila, Cox's Bazar.

Activities of the Project is community awareness through miking for Rohingya and Host community in Ukhiya, Cox's Bazar for approximately 1 month; disseminate emergency response messages on COVID-19 using mike set, volunteer and local transport (CNG) at Ukhiya for host communities and adjacent

Rohingya communities for 26 days in May and June 2020. Every transport will be equipped with a 02 mike set with all necessary equipment, 02 volunteer announcer along with recorded message will move from the different corner in selected camps and Ukhiya Upazila.

COUNSELLING VICTIMS OF GENDER-BASED VIOLENCE:

ACLAB has provided counselling support to the gender-based violence victims of the Rohingya community through communication for communities with the support rendered by BRAC. ACLAB creates awareness among the community so that the community can be sensitized against gender-based violence and become aware of their daily health and safety issues.

COMMUNITY LEGAL SERVICES PROGRAM (CLS):

ACLAB has implemented Community Legal Service (CLS) Program in Mohammadpur and Savar areas in Dhaka district among poor and marginalized people supported by Bangladesh Legal Aid and Services Trust (BLAST) funded by the Department for International Development (DFID) consortium consisting of Maxwell Stamp PLC through UK AID and British Council Bangladesh and Centre for Effective Dispute Resolution (CEDR) as a partner. The objective of the program is to provide greater access to justice to poor and marginalized people in Bangladesh.

FUTURE PLAN OF ACLAB:

To provide enhanced and further services to greater number of people of the country who are in desperate need of basic and rights-based services to render services to the nation, ACLAB feels it indispensable to expand its projects/programs pragmatically and systematically so that it can realize the desirable goals and objectives within a reasonable period:



1. **Intensifying activity for the Rohingya displaced persons:** ACLAB is gravely willing to birthrate/control and Reproductive & Sexual Health education among the Rohingya women consolidate and further extend its activities for the sustainable wellbeing of the Rohingya by (1) Providing Vocational Training to the Rohingya youths for supplementing their family incomes, (2) Providing Family Planning services to the eligible couples of the Rohingya to lower and adolescents, (3) Livelihood activities.
2. **Explore new areas of project execution:** ACLAB will embark on initiatives to operate projects on environment, climate change and disaster management, tuberculosis, socio- economic rehabilitation of the People with Disability (PWD) and beggars and such other issues of national interest and importance. ACLAB has been working in these fields with its ongoing project activities, but considering the increasing need and demand, ACLAB wishes to initiate separate and distinct projects on the issues.
3. **Strengthening existing project implementation:** ACLAB plans to put its efforts to strengthen project implementation through human resource development and program diversification & replication of the successful projects as well as monitoring, documentation, evaluation and internal audit. Necessary steps shall also be taken for establishing effective linkage and networking with GOB, NGOs/INGOs and corporate sectors for enlarging ACLAB's working spectrum.
4. **Strengthen quality initiative in epidemic situation:** ACLAB shall make all-out efforts to fortify, strengthen and equip itself with necessary resources – technical know-how, manpower, money & material to face any kind of epidemic situation that arises in future primarily in its project areas then gradually spread in other areas.
